Q: Why does Oral7® Moisturising Toothpaste not foam like other

A: Because it does not contain any Sodium Lauryl Sulphate, a synthetic foaming detergent that can cause Dry Mouth.

Medical conditions and treatments affecting oral health

There are a number of medical conditions³ and treatments that can disturb a healthy mouth:

- Diabetes
- Chemotherapy
- Asthma
- Radiotherapy
- Sjögren's Syndrome
- Kidney dialysis

These can limit the flow of saliva which can lead to 'Dry Mouth' (Xerostomia).

A dry mouth can cause tooth decay, bad breath, gum disease and aphthous ulcers when the mouth's natural flora is disturbed, allowing harmful bacteria to flourish.

We all moisturise our face, hands and/or body on a daily basis. Why not moisturise the mouth and gums? When it comes to oral health, it is not only the teeth that need a little TLC, but the gums and inside of the mouth that need special care too.
